SUMMARY: AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A REVISION AND CODIFICATION OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF EUREKA COUNTY.

TITLE: THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE 2014 EUREKA COUNTY CODE ADOPTION.

The Board of Commissioners of the County of Eureka, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada, hereby does ordain this revision and codification of the general ordinances of Eureka County, effective the 24th day of July, 2014, to be known as the 2014 Eureka County Code.

The Board proclaims that three (3) copies of this Code were filed with the County Clerk at least one (1) week before final adoption.

The Board further proclaims that a notice of the filing was published in the Eureka Sentinel at least one (1) week before final adoption, stating that copies of the Code are available for examination by the general public at the Office of the County Clerk.

The Board directs the Office of the District Attorney to publish (by title only) this ordinance adopting the 2014 Eureka County Code once (1) a week for two (2) weeks in the Eureka Sentinel, and include a statement that copies of the Code may be examined by the general public at the Office of the County Clerk.

The Board directs the Office of the District Attorney to reproduce at least twenty-five (25) copies of the 2014 Eureka County Code, and file at least three (3) copies of the Code with the County Clerk, and two (2) copies with the Librarian of the Supreme Court Law Library.

Effective Date:

This revision and codification of the 2014 Eureka County Code shall be effective upon adoption and publication as provided by the Nevada revised Statutes.
