CALL TO ORDER

The Board of Eureka County Commissioners met pursuant to law on May 5, 2026. Present were Chairman Rich McKay, Vice Chair Marty Plaskett, Commissioner Mike Schoenwald via Webex, District Attorney Ted Beutel and Deputy Clerk Recorder Katelyn Ziemann. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. The interactive video conferencing system was connected between Crescent Valley and Eureka for the entire meeting.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the agenda with moving the Crescent Valley Town Board item up until after Public Comment. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

The meeting began with the pledge of allegiance.



2. Discuss, approve or deny a request from the Eureka Volunteer Fire Department for a donation to purchase the July 4th fireworks in the amount of \$9,603.63 to be paid from Commissioner Misc. Grants (010-001-53010-085). **(For Possible Action)**

Commissioner Plaskett commented he would like to see the total amount decrease for next year, he feels the amount has gotten high.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the donation in the amount of \$9,603.63 to the Eureka Volunteer Fire Department to purchase the July 4th fireworks. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

3. Discuss, approve or deny cancelling the regularly scheduled Board of County Commissioners meeting on June 16, 2026 and scheduling an additional meeting on June 18, 2026 in order to canvas the June 9, 2026 Primary Election. **(For Possible Action)**

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve cancelling the regularly scheduled Board of County Commissioners meeting on June 16, 2026 and scheduling an additional meeting on June 18, 2026. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

4. Discuss, approve or deny a Record of Survey in support of a boundary line adjustment for Diamond C, LLC, and LC Properties, LLC (APN 007-210-38 and APN 007-210-39). **(For Possible Action)**

The purpose for the boundary line adjustment for APN 007-210-38 and APN 007-210-39 is to include the power line on the property instead of off the property. The survey was prepared by High Desert Engineering and was approved by Public Works.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the Record of Survey in support of a boundary line adjustment for Diamond C, LLC, and LC Properties, LLC (APN 007-210-38 and APN 007-210-39). Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

5. Discuss, approve or deny authorizing the Public Works Director to initiate change orders to the existing drilling services contract with Parsons Drilling for the Kobeh Valley Well Project within remaining budgeted and appropriated funds, consistent with the approved grant scope and timeframe, and in compliance with applicable federal procurement requirements, with notification to the Board following any change orders. **(For Possible Action)**

In September of 2023 Public Works entered the NWC Conservation Grant and Agreement for \$2.5 million, the grant requires they reach a 75% expenditure threshold by May 15th, they are currently at 65%. The recovery results from an 8-hour step test and a 96-hour constant flow test conclusions run parallel with the grant deadlines. Public Works is requesting the approval to move forward with a change order to the existing drilling services contract with Parsons Drilling for the Kobeh Valley Well Project to record a permanent easement or a purchase agreement with DV Gravel & Exploration for the County's water supply infrastructure at APN 007-320-04.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve Public Works to initiate change orders to the existing drilling services contract with Parsons Drilling for the Kobeh Valley Well Project, record a permanent easement or purchase agreement DV Gravel & Exploration for the County's water supply infrastructure at APN 007-320-04 and approve scheduling a public hearing for June 2, 2026 at 11 am. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

6. Discuss, approve or deny authorizing the Public Works Director to execute and record a permanent easement or purchase agreement with DV Gravel & Exploration for the County's water supply infrastructure at APN 007-320-04. Such authorization shall be under the same material terms as the previously approved Access and Conditional Purchase Agreement, upon satisfaction of the condition's precedent therein, or upon such earlier date as the Public Works Director determines necessary to protect the County's infrastructure interests. **(For Possible Action)**

Commissioner Plaskett seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

MYBRARY – Kassie Antonucci, Director

1. Report on projects and activities. **(Discussion)**

Assistant Director Melissa Spence reported the Crescent Valley Mybrary had a total attendance of 305 for January, February and March with a circulation of 208 items, 43 internet users and 199 current library holders. They have been holding story time every Friday at 10:30am. Eureka Mybrary had a total of 461 attendances with a circulation of 661 items, 67 internet users and 405 current library cards. They are preparing for their summer reading programs.

IT-Misty Rowley, CIO

1. Report on IT projects and activities. **(Discussion)**

CIO Misty Rowley reported her office worked on the newsletter and social media, the contract management system implementation and performed maintenance on the internet gateway. They worked on installing dashcams and cradle points for the Sheriff's office. They attended a call with AT&T and the Sheriff Office regarding the VESTA project.

2. Discuss, approve or deny ratifying the purchase of Microsoft 365 licensing from SHI through the NASPO cooperative purchasing contract, Contract No. AR2488, for the term of March 3, 2026 through March 2, 2027, in the total amount of \$73,732.54, authorize the CIO to sign the quotation and any related ordering documents outside of the meeting, and authorize the CIO to add or remove licenses as needed throughout the term. **(For Possible Action)**

The Microsoft 365 licensing from SHI through the NASPO cooperative purchasing contract covers 112 users.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve ratifying the purchase of Microsoft 365 licensing from SHI through the NASPO cooperative purchasing contract, Contract No. AR2488, for the term of March 3, 2026 through March 2, 2027, in the total amount of \$73,732.54 and authorize CIO Rowley to sign the quotation and any related ordering documents outside of the meeting, and the authority to add or remove licenses as needed throughout the term. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

HUMAN RESOURCES - Cristina Lopez, Human Resources Director

1. Report on Human Resources projects and activities. (Discussion)

Human Resources Director Cristina Lopez reported they are still recruiting for the Sheriffs office, EMS technician, dispatchers and volunteers. There is a new volunteer for Crescent Valley EMS and 2 in process in Eureka. Director Lopez reported 3 ongoing investigations and 1 soon concluded. She has a meeting with MarketShare PR and the 4-10 Committee to coordinate the upcoming survey in June.

TREASURER – Pernecia Johnson, Treasurer

1. Review of Treasurer’s Report for March 2026. (Discussion)

The board reviewed the March 2026 Treasurers report.

2. Review affidavit of mailing delinquent tax notices for real property parcels. (Discussion)

The board reviewed the affidavit of mailing delinquent tax notices for real property parcels.

3. Review and consider accepting Treasurer’s verified return of sale and reconciliation of trust property for the tax delinquent properties auction held on April 8, 2026. (For Possible Action)

There were 9 parcels in the tax delinquent properties auction held on April 8, 2026 equaling \$59,000.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve accepting the Treasurer’s verified return of sale and reconciliation of trust property for the tax delinquent properties auction held on April 8, 2026. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

4. Review and consider adopting a resolution directing the County Treasurer to execute and file quitclaim deeds for record with the County Recorder and deliver said quitclaim deeds for properties sold at auction on April 8, 2026. (For Possible Action)

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the resolution and directed the County Treasurer to execute and file quitclaim deeds for record with the County Recorder and deliver said quitclaim deeds for properties sold at auction on April 8, 2026. 1. Report on Sheriff's Office projects and activities. (Discussion)

Sheriff Miles Umina reported the dash cameras have been installed in 14 vehicles, on May 14th Deputy Flemming will graduate from POST. He has been working with Lexipol on updating the Sheriff Office Policies.

ROAD DEPARTMENT – Scooter Mentaberry, Road Supervisor

1. Report on Road Department projects and activities. (Discussion)

Road Supervisor Scooter Mentaberry reported on the roads they have finished grading including the roads with MOU's with McEwen and Nevada Gold Mines. They have started spraying weeds along the roadsides in Diamond Valley, the fairgrounds and sewer ponds. They have worked on the area where they are going to develop a gravel pit on county road 101. They installed road signs at McCluskey Pass to help guide trucks trying to access the mines.

2. Discuss, approve or deny setting a public hearing to invite public comments and consider adopting an updated Eureka County Road Map which identifies Main Roads, General Roads, and Minor Roads within Eureka County. (For Possible Action)

The last time there was an updated Eureka County Road Map was 2021, they would like to identify new and updated Main Roads, General Roads, and Minor Roads within Eureka County.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve setting a public hearing on June 2nd at 10am to invite public comments and consider adopting an updated Eureka County Road Map which identifies Main Roads, General Roads, and Minor Roads within Eureka County. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

PUBLIC WORKS – Jeb Rowley, Public Works Director

1. Report on Public Works projects and activities. (Discussion)

Public Works Director, Jeb Rowley reported upgrades were made to Diamond Valley Fire truck 68, the buildings and grounds crew have been busy locating water utilities for the fiber install happening in Diamond Valley. The Crescent Valley crew have been working on the park renovations, removing old bark and plastic and preparing for the equipment to be installed. Director Rowley attended a meeting with NDF and BLM to discuss pre-season multi-jurisdiction and boundary lines. The Ely-Elko district will have 2 contracted helicopters and smoke jumpers, 10 engines and 2 dozers ready for the season.

2. Discuss, approve or deny Quote #374693 for purchasing ten (10) SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) units from LN Curtis, for an amount not to exceed \$90,185.00, utilizing funds budgeted for capital outlay (010-001-55010-000) in the County Commissioner's Fund. (For Possible Action)

10 SCBA Self Contained Breathing Apparatus would continue the buildouts at the fire departments, for a total of 15 in Eureka, 12 in Crescent Valley, 4 in Diamond Valley, 4 in Beowawe and 5 in Pine Valley.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve Quote #374693 for purchasing ten (10) SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) units from LN Curtis, for an amount not to exceed \$90,185.00, utilizing funds budgeted for capital outlay (010-001-55010-000) in the County Commissioner's Fund. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

3. Discuss, approve or deny applications for a 3/4-inch residential water service for APN 002-038-03 in the town of Crescent Valley. **(For Possible Action)**

Approved with item #4.

4. Discuss, approve or deny applications for a 3/4-inch residential water service for APN 002-038-04 in the town of Crescent Valley. **(For Possible Action)**

Items 3 and 4 were approved together.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve applications for a 3/4-inch residential water service for APN 002-038-04 and APN 002-038-03 in the town of Crescent Valley. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

5. Review and consider approval of the Construction Manager at Risk, Guaranteed Maximum Price Contract with Sierra Nevada Construction Inc., for Phase 2C Road and Utility Improvement Project utilizing funds budgeted for capital outlay in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund and the Eureka Water/Sewer Utility Fund. **(For Possible Action)**

Phase 2C Road and Utility Improvement Project will cover everything from Ruby Hill Street to Bullion Street, the project will tie into the spring on the west side of town.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the Construction Manager at Risk, Guaranteed Maximum Price Contract with Sierra Nevada Construction Inc., for Phase 2C Road and Utility Improvement Project utilizing funds budgeted for capital outlay in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund and the Eureka Water/Sewer Utility Fund. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

6. Discuss, approve or deny proposal from Construction Services with Lumos & Associates in the amount of \$792,150.00 for the Town of Eureka Phase 2C Road & Utility Project utilizing funds budgeted for capital outlay in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund and the Eureka Water/Sewer Utility Fund. **(For Possible Action)**

Hunter Morai with Lumos and Associates presented the proposal for the construction services for the Town of Eureka Phase 2C Road & Utility Project.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the proposal from Construction Services with Lumos & Associates in the amount of \$792,150.00 for the Town of Eureka Phase 2C Road & Utility Project utilizing funds budgeted for capital outlay in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund and the Eureka Water/Sewer Utility Fund. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

7. Discuss, approve or deny quote from McCandless Truck Center in the amount of \$25,763.45 for a Hitch and Plow for the Airport Snowplow under Sourcewell contract #080124-NVS utilizing funds budgeted in (010-016-55010-000) Airport Capital Outlay Fund. **(For Possible Action)**

The existing snowplow located at the airport purchased with AIP funding has a bent frame as a result of the plow, Peterbuilt is paying for the frame to be rebuilt. The quote from McCandless Truck Center will be to purchase a hitch and plow that is properly fitted for the snowplow.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the quote from McCandless Truck Center in the amount of \$25,763.45 for a Hitch and Plow for the Airport Snowplow under Sourcewell contract #080124-NVS utilizing funds budgeted in (010-016-55010-000) Airport Capital Outlay Fund. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

NATURAL RESOURCES – Jake Tibbitts, Natural Resources Manager

1. Report on current and emerging natural resource issues affecting Eureka County. **(Discussion)**

Natural Resources Manager Jake Tibbitts reported he attended a groundwater modeling meeting at the I-80 Gold's Reno offices to discuss dewatering as they go underground. On April 27th the Conservation District met and approved grant applications for greater sage grouse habitat enhancement work. Manager Tibbitts was reappointed as the Chair for the State Land Use Planning Advisory Council (SLUPAC). On April 29th the County Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife met and held their tag quota meeting, looking over proposed quotas for tags on wildlife species and made their recommendations. On May 11th the water law working group, Manager Tibbitts has been participating in, will meet at the Reno Mining Association Offices. NACO has a discussion upcoming about counties and their momentum to develop Community Benefits Agreements for mining and renewable energy focusing on data centers. Many counties are being asked to house large-scale data centers that are water and land intensive without providing much employment or tax revenue. NACO is focusing discussions on the issue leading up to the next legislative session and what that could look like in Nevada. Manager Tibbitts and Commissioner Plaskett will be attending the Public Lands Committee meeting in Winnemucca on May 15th. The BLM has issued a notice for scoping comments on the oil and gas lease sale on the properties located in Eureka County, Manager Tibbitts will bring it to a future meeting.

2. Discuss and consider topics and other related details for presentation to the Nevada Legislature's Committee on Public Lands at their Winnemucca meeting on May 15, 2026. **(For Possible Action)**

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the topics and other related details for the presentation Commissioner Plaskett and Manager Tibbitts will give to the Nevada Legislature's Committee on Public Lands at their Winnemucca meeting on May 15, 2026. Commissioner Schoenwald seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

The board took a 10-minute break.

Chairman McKay called the meeting back to order at 11:14am.

1. Review Tentative Budgets and discuss, approve or deny possible eliminations of expenses, additions of expenses, personnel requests, capital outlay requests and any other budget related items listed in the tentative budgets. *Note: These changes will be incorporated into the Final Budget which is due to the Nevada Department of Taxation no later than June 1, 2026. Final budgets will be reviewed and approved on May 19, 2026. (For Possible Action)*

The Board along with Comptroller Kim Todd reviewed the tentative department budgets, the Treasurer budget decreased, Recorder decreased, Assessor's increased \$12,000 for data software contracts, Human Resources increased \$50,000 for personnel support and data software contracts. Elections increased \$1,000, Comptroller's increased \$700 for postage, the annual audit and budget decreased due to no longer having a software program. The federal grant limit increased from \$750,000 to \$1 million, there is still FEMA grant money they will use for the Kobeh Valley project. The airport and NRAC had no changes. IT increased \$350,000 to cover contract services and computer software. The planning commission increased \$120,000 to cover the master plan required. The miscellaneous budget remained the same, it pays for tax liability, leave payouts, insurance and COBRA. Juvenile Probation decreased \$800. District Attorney increased \$11,000. District Court increased \$60,000 for indigent legal aid and conflict counsel. Sheriffs Office increased \$42,000 for mental awareness requirements by the state. LEPC remained the same, but Emergency Management increased \$150,000 for the VFA grant. The Eureka clinic decreased. Ambulance increased to cover the new contractor services. The Swimming Pool decreased \$1,500. The Senior Center increased \$15,000 to cover the rising costs of food, the senior center is almost completely grant funded. The museum decreased \$300 and the Parks increased \$14,000. The Library increased \$500, the Opera House increased \$9,000 for the new cultural program. The retiree health match increased and continues to fluctuate as people add and get removed. The road fund increased \$140,000 to cover contract services which will be reimbursed by Nevada Gold Mines. Ag Extension drastically dropped due to their donation to the Boys and Girls Club. Ag District and the Building and Reserve fund remained the same. Capital Projects increased \$1,000 in investment fees. Eureka Town Fire Department increased \$1,000 in insurance. The streets and lighting remained the same, Eureka water remained the same. Crescent Valley Town Board increased salaries due to them requesting more pay per meeting. The Crescent Valley Fire increased \$1,000 in insurance. Crescent Valley street maintenance increased \$200 in electricity. The TV District sets and manages their own budget, they increased \$1,500 in admin. The Recreation Board increased for a donation to the VFW park. Nevada Division of Mineral and Accident Indigent are passthroughs, so Eureka does not get any of that money.

The board discussed Capital Outlay, they will carry over \$500,000 to cover the Sheriff's Office 911 upgrades, the ambulances are having state radio replacements and monitor replacements for \$400,000. The Commissioners budget always allots \$1.5 million in the emergency budget. IT has software updates for \$811,000, Building and Grounds access controls will cost \$100,000 and Streetlights will rollover \$250,000. The Sheriff's Office is budgeting for 3 new patrol cars and minor jail upgrades. The Crescent Valley Park has cameras and a walking path for \$200,000. District Court will upgrade their JAVS system for \$72,000. Justice Court is budgeting for a new Probation Officer Vehicle. LEPC will receive a grant of \$36,000. The Road department budgeted \$1 million for a grater and water truck and trailer. RTC will increase to \$400,000, the Sheriff Office generator will be a rollover. Crescent Valley Town requested a new road sign and basketball backboard for \$12,000.
